



YMCA at Norton Commons Board of Advisors

The Board of Advisors of the YMCA at Norton Commons is essential in providing oversight, ensuring resources and supporting the organization's strategic direction as set forth by the YMCA of Greater Louisville Association Board of Directors and Chief Executive Officer. As a board member, you will articulate, safeguard, model and promote the values of the YMCA and ultimately contribute to strengthening the foundations of our community through youth development, healthy living and social responsibility.

MEETINGS

The Board of Advisors will meet monthly from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. typically on the third Thursday of the month from August through May with a break in June and July; 10 meetings per year. Board of Advisors should be committed to attending all meetings with the exception of truly unavoidable conflicts. Ad Hoc Committees will develop as needed and meet accordingly.

TERM

Board members are elected to serve no more than two consecutive three-year terms in addition to the completion of partial terms within a vacated seat if applicable. Members may also be re-elected at one-year intervals.

ATTRIBUTES

Board members shall be respected citizens of the community with an interest in the programs and objectives of the Y. They must have the willingness to be informed and enthusiastic about the YMCA of Greater Louisville and specifically the YMCA at Norton Commons Branch.

PHILANTHROPY

BOARD MEETING ATTENDANCE

To be an engaged member of the board, attendance of at least 70% of scheduled meetings is expected.
